

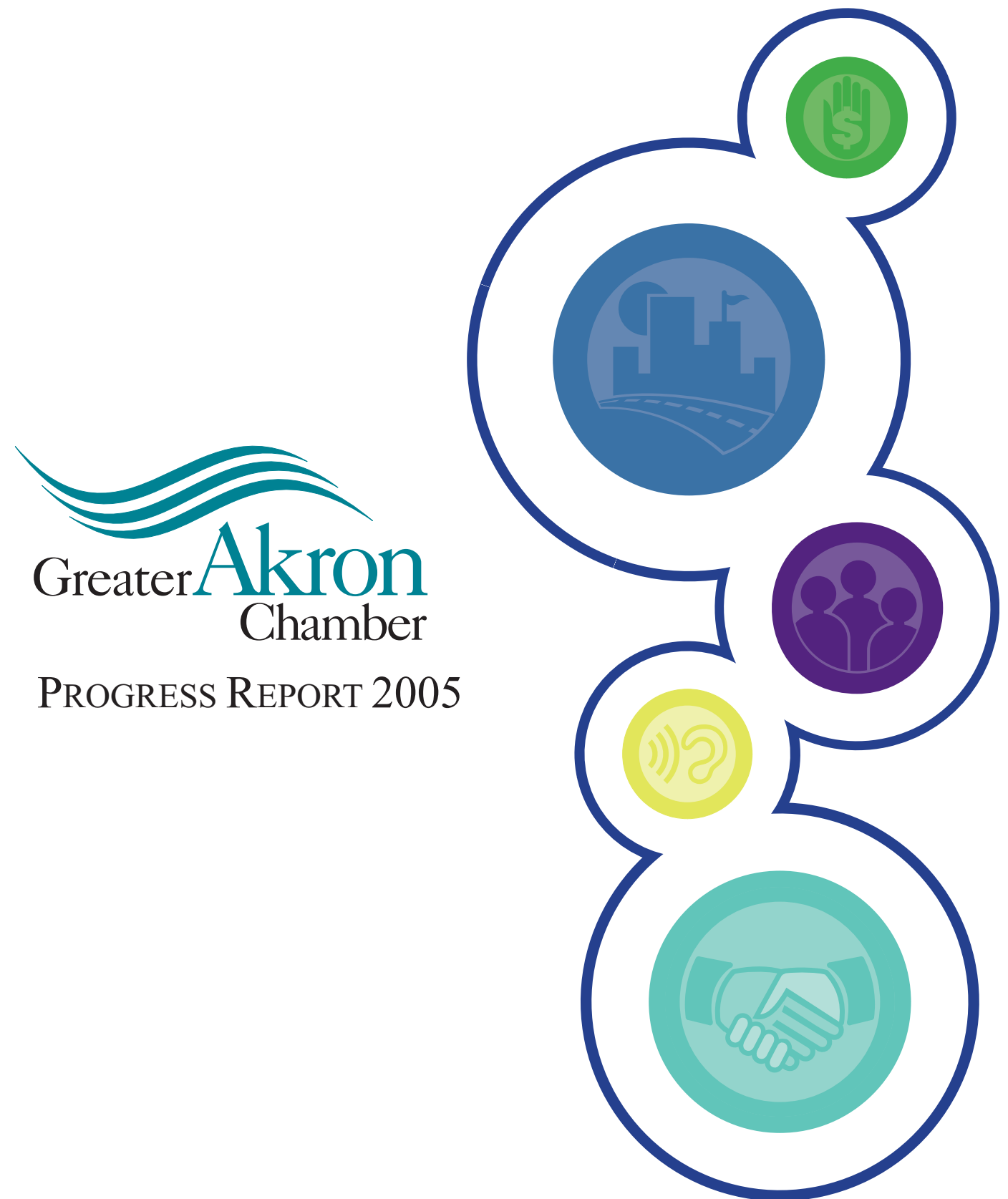

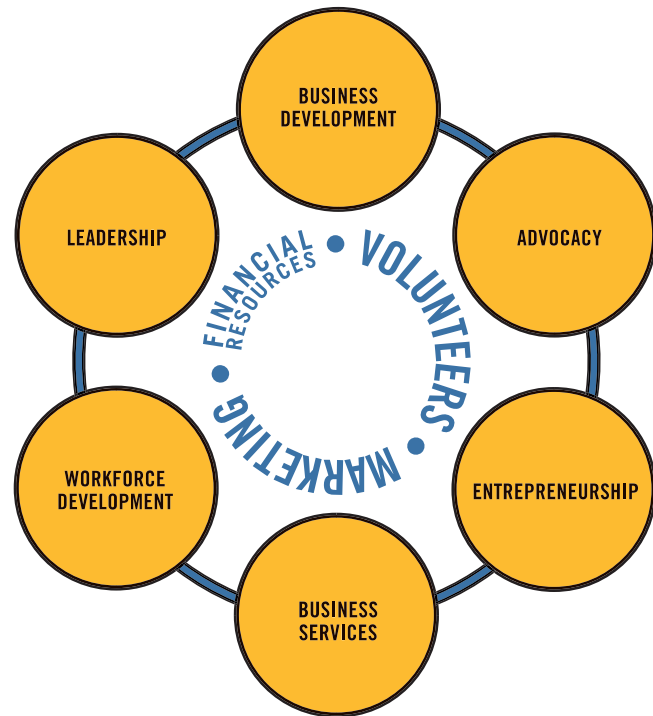
The mission of the Greater Akron Chamber is to promote economic development to benefit the people of the Greater Akron Region.

COLLABORATING TO RECRUIT AND RETAIN COMPANIES – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Partnered with Team NEO to implement an aggressive marketing strategy to retain 6 core industry sectors.
- Assisted 21 companies with their investments in the Greater Akron Region totaling \$60 million, creating 630 new jobs, and retaining 700 jobs. Collaborated with economic development allies to attract Homesite Insurance from Boston, Massachusetts to the Akron Region; to support Yellow Roadway Corporation's newly established subsidiary, YRC Regional Transportation; and to assist Applied Vision, Inc.'s expansion efforts.
- Participated in site dedications and officially recognized the following companies for their local investment: Wacker Silicones, ACRT Inc., Doyle Systems, item MB Kit Systems, Noble Industrial Metals, Preferred Rubber, Cornerstone Products, and Corporate Express.
- Showcased the Greater Akron Region at 9 trade shows—Society of Automotive Engineering World Congress in Detroit, Michigan; K Fair Messe and Hannover Messe in Germany; Corporate Real Estate Executives (CORENET) in Toronto and Las Vegas; FabTech International in Chicago; American Chemical Society Rubber Show in Pittsburgh, the Ohio Fuel Cell Symposium and the Great Lakes Industrial Show in Cleveland. This participation resulted in 175 investment leads for the region.
- Hosted the first “Discover Northeast Ohio” area familiarization tour in conjunction with the NEC World Golf Championships to promote Greater Akron to site selectors.
- Coordinated the visits of 8 foreign business delegations (Japanese, 2 German, Swiss, Russian, Indian, Chinese, and Turkish) to help them establish business investment opportunities.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Partnered with NorTech and the Ohio Polymer Strategy Council in the successful bid to establish the Center for Multifunctional Polymer Nanomaterials and Devices.
- Partnered with OH!Polymer Inc. to deliver cost reduction and operations efficiency seminars for Akron area polymer and metalworking companies.
- Provided office space and support to NEO411.biz, an organization that serves as a one-source portal of network providers for Northeast Ohio entrepreneurs. The NEO411.biz staff connected 50 people to important business resources.
- Collaborated with JumpStart Inc. to provide counseling for high growth companies and to provide pre-seed and seed capital.
- Co-sponsored an event with COSE to promote the Northeast Ohio Business Plan Challenge, offering participants assistance with building upgraded business plans.
- Closed 2 loans for entrepreneurial companies that will result in technology applications and expansions globally and the creation/retention of 70 jobs through the Akron Development Fund.
- Co-sponsored a seminar on Innovation with CAMP (Community of Smaller Manufacturers).
- Became part of the leadership team for The University of Akron Research Foundation’s Arch Angel Network to promote investments in technology-based enterprises in Northeast Ohio.
- Developed an Akron Succession Planning program with Kent State University’s Ohio Employee Ownership Center.

MARKETING THE REGION – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Created a new membership communications campaign, “*Connect with the Chamber,*” to grow membership.
- Led the charge to develop a stronger identity for Greater Akron and selected Hitchcock Fleming & Associates Inc. (hfa) as its marketing communications agency of record.

ATTRACTING AND RETAINING TALENT – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Continued the community/leadership dialogue with Rebecca Ryan, Next Generation Consulting, Inc., to create actions that will help slow the emigration of knowledge workers.
 - The Chamber, along with the 4 major young professional (YP) organizations, held an event that attracted 600 people. The event gave members of the YP groups, business leaders, and the community-at-large a forum to celebrate the unique qualities of Akron through the eyes of the next generation.  - Rebecca Ryan presented her 18 final recommendations on how the region can attract and retain young talent. The Chamber has taken the lead on 3 of her recommendations: (1) staff a full-time executive director to serve Greater Akron’s young professionals’ groups; (2) develop a multimedia tool kit that Greater Akron’s employers can customize for their talent attraction efforts; and (3) convene employer roundtables in the industries in which the talent needs are the greatest.
- Helped kick off College 360° Brain Drain initiative—targeted at college graduates—to enroll, engage, and employ more college students in the region. The Chamber continues to encourage business leaders to create more internships.
- Published a Greater Akron Relocation Guide, “*Alive With Opportunities*” as an employee recruitment tool.
- Partnered with the Summit Educational Initiative to launch the Goodyear Leadership Network for Education with 17 charter members to develop experiential learning networks (assistantships, shadowing, etc.). The charter members included public schools, private and parochial schools, universities, and non-profit organizations with a focus on education in Summit County.

THE VOICE OF BUSINESS – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Led efforts in the state legislature to exempt jigs, dies, patterns, and drawings from tangible personal property tax in the Governor’s Tax Reform proposal, saving manufacturers in Northeast Ohio tens of thousands of dollars in taxes.
- Worked successfully with the City of Akron, Akron Public Schools, The University of Akron, and the National Inventors Hall of Fame to fund and develop a math, science, and technology community learning center.
- Helped the Summit County Workforce Investment Board create its new One-Stop Employment Center called “The Job Center.”
- Supported the BizMat project for the Greater Akron Region allowing BizMat’s Recycling Center to assist small businesses with hazardous waste disposal.
- Contacted state legislators in support of the Institute for Global Studies, as well as the Telecom legislation.
- Supported the National Transportation Reauthorization Act with our senators to increase federal support for highway infrastructure.
- Hosted congressional luncheons with Congressmen Ralph Regula, Steve LaTourette, and Ted Strickland, bringing our congressional representatives face-to-face with Chamber members.
- Provided informative programs on the Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Project and the “How-to’s of Brownfield Redevelopment.”
- Helped secure non-stop air service from Akron-Canton Airport to Denver through Frontier Airlines and to Las Vegas through AirTran Airlines.
- Advocated on behalf of the college community to establish a Doctor of Pharmacy degree program at Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine (NEOUCOM).
- Supported the passage of Issue 1 Jobs for Ohio by spearheading a letter-writing campaign and hosting Lt. Governor Bruce Johnson to discuss the issue’s importance.
- Initiated a relationship with Ohio Treasurer Jeanette Bradley by having her visit the Chamber.

- Implemented CapWiz, which is a grassroots advocacy online tool to provide a resource for members to communicate their views to area lawmakers.
- Lobbied the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) for the creation of an Akron high school basketball tournament for NCAA recruitment.
- Supported the passage of the Summit County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities (MRDD) levy.
- Endorsed the Akron Public Schools’ 5.9 mil operation levy request.
- Continued advocating on behalf of the Seasons Road interchange on State Route 8.
- Hosted Local Officials Recognition Luncheon and recognized three local legislators.
- Lobbied on behalf of Summit Health Ventures and BioEnterprise for Third Frontier funding.

KEEPING THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY INFORMED – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Attracted 630 business leaders (a 20% increase over 2004) to the Chamber’s Annual Meeting, which featured Rebecca Ryan speaking about her year-long work in the Greater Akron Region.
- Published 12 key demographic and economic reports including a polymer directory, economic indicators, and population trends used by companies making critical decisions on locating, expanding, or creating a business in the Greater Akron Region.
- Provided economic and demographic community information to 700 people interested in the Greater Akron Region.
- Kept members informed of activities through six *Directions* newsletters and through the Chamber’s web site, www.greaterakronchamber.org, which received over 165,000 visits.
- The media relied on the Greater Akron Chamber for its expertise in business development, advocacy, and workforce development including talent attraction, business services and issues relating to entrepreneurship, and small businesses. The Chamber and its initiatives appeared in print, radio, and television 137 times, an increase of 140%.

SERVICE FOR OUR MEMBERS – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Enrolled 54 members in the Chamber’s health care plans, bringing the total enrollment to 748.
- Provided members with Workers Compensation group ratings, saving them over \$4 million.
- Hosted 37 networking events that brought 2,600 people together to share best business practices and to create solid business contacts.
- Continued collaboration with other organizations, such as SCORE, in assisting 1,277 small business clients with business advice.
- Awarded 3 local business leaders for their achievements: “Entrepreneur of the Year,” Timothy Sheeler, First Credit International Corp./Healthcare Resolution Services, Inc.; “New and Emerging Business of the Year,” Jeffrey S. Ruby, The Ruby Group Inc.; “Small Business Advocate of the Year,” Bruce A. Jentner, The Jentner Group.

INVESTOR GROWTH – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Increased number of investors—companies that make significant financial contributions to the Chamber, ensuring the implementation of Advance Greater Akron—from 77 in 2003 to 137 to date.

RECOGNITION – OUR PROGRESS TO DATE

- Received an award for “Excellence in Communications” for the Advance Greater Akron DVD from the American Chamber of Commerce Executives—a nationally recognized association with 1,300 chambers of commerce/economic development organizations.
- *Expansion Management* magazine ranked Akron, Ohio with “Five Star” distinctions in its Quality of Life Quotient™ ranking of metro areas where people can enjoy a career and raise a family; its Mayor’s Challenge™ ranking of business climates to expand or relocate; and in its Logistics Quotient™ study, ranking the most logistics-friendly metros in the country.
