Issue 2 is a bipartisan effort endorsed by Governor Ted Strickland, Lt. Governor Lee Fisher, Senate President Bill Harris and Speaker Jon Husted. The continuation of Clean Ohio would authorize the issuance of \$400 million in bonds to help ensure a quality life for all Ohioans by redeveloping urban areas to foster economic growth, preserving natural areas and farmland, and protecting waterways. According to Ohio Department of Development statistics, the Clean Ohio Fund's initial \$200 million investment in brownfield cleanup is projected to create at least 15,000 jobs and yield an economic impact of close to \$2.6 billion – without raising taxes.
